


Preparing Marta Crane entrance for plantings

- 1- Call- Call Before You Dig folks for marking electric and water lines.
- 2- Size of planting area will dictate how many shrubs will be needed.
- 3- Mark area with garden hose then chalk around hose. Spray marked area with Round-Up.
- 4- Turn with tiller. Bramlett Shoals side add two scoops of top soil and then re-till. Livia Crane side add 4-5 scoops of top soil and re-till.
- 5- Install edging. Use rubber edging that will bend to conform to curves of site.
- 6- Add plants. Fertilize and water.
- 7- Add 3" wood mulch.

These may be good tree planting ideas for Livia Crane's side of her property. These are evergreen trees.

Spartan Chinese Juniper - Grows 10 - 20 feet tall and 4 - 8 feet wide. Fast grower.
Small Anise Tree (*Illicium Parviflorum*).

Leyland Cypress is no longer considered a good tree to plant due to the problem of cankers killing all or part of the tree. I have had this problem in my yard.


